

TIME TO READ!

Before reading: Ask children what they notice about the cover illustration. What do they think might happen in this story? Tell them the story is written from the perspective of Seymour, the hamster on the cover.

RELATED ACTIVITIES

WHAT SEYMOUR SEES (AGES 5-12)

Materials: white paper, black crayons

Did you know that hamsters have poor eyesight and are color blind? It is believed that they only see black and white. Create a picture using only a black crayon on white paper. Experiment with the amount of pressure used to make the black lighter or darker. What is your favorite color? Would you miss colors if they no longer existed? Explain.

HAMSTER FREEZE (AGES 5-12)

Hamsters are energetic and love to run. Explain that while the music is on everyone should be running. When the music is off, everyone should freeze.
