intimidate(ed) p 2	frighten or overawe (someone), especially in order to make them do what one wants.
hustle(ed) p 3	force (someone) to move hurriedly or unceremoniously in a specified direction.
eternity p 6	infinite or unending time.
exasperate(ed) p 6	intensely irritated and frustrated
sympathetic p 8	feeling, showing, or expressing sympathy.
cluster p 11	a group of similar things or people positioned or occurring closely together.
contemplate(ed) p 14	look thoughtfully for a long time at.
temporary p 18	lasting for only a limited period of time; not permanent

instinctively p 75	without conscious thought; by natural instinct.
stammer(ed) p 77	speak with sudden involuntary pauses and a tendency to repeat the initial letters of words
anticipate(ed) p 78	regard as probable; expect or predict.
coincidence p 83	a remarkable concurrence of events or circumstances without apparent causal connection.
discreetly p 89	in a careful and prudent manner, especially in order to keep something confidential or to avoid embarrassment.
incredulous p 89	(of a person or their manner) unwilling or unable to believe something
culprit p 91	a person who is responsible for a crime or other misdeed.
definitive p 94	(of a conclusion or agreement) done or reached decisively and with authority
suspicious p 101	having or showing a cautious distrust of someone or something.
dismissively p 102	in a manner that suggests that something or someone is unworthy of consideration
