## MATH

SPLIT IT
Although it was easy to split the pair of sandals (one each), it wasn't very practical. Challenge students to split a variety of things that don't have a midline: an irregular shape, an uneven number of pencils, a desk in your classroom, a classroom chore or an in-school errand. Have them provide answers/solutions. Then ask them, "Can everything be split evenly?"

## SEL, SOCIAL STUDIES

 PEN PALSLina and Feroza will soon be living far apart but will still cherish their friendship. Ask students if they have friends in other parts of the country or world. Have students pin
 or mark a map to show where they have connections. Use a platform, such as ePals, to start a classroom-based pen pal program with your students.

## ART, SOCIAL STUDIES

ONE DAY I WILL
Children living in refugee camps, like children everywhere, have dreams of their futures. Help your students recognize their common humanity by investigating the project One Day I Will (https://www.vtremeau.com/one-day-i-will). Allow your students to look at the digital cards and see if they have an aspiration in common with one of the children featured in the project. Talk about how dreams about the future are formed (e.g., role models, stories, experiences).
