In addition to her talents on the soccer field, Alex Morgan is a role model off the field. She wrote a series of books for kids called <u>The Kicks</u>. In these books she writes about being a part of a team. The girls on the team learn lessons about sportsmanship and friendship. These lessons are important to Alex. She says, "I think it's huge, especially in team sports, for players to be able to rely on each other and to really trust in each other."

Alex believes in equality for women's sports. When she found out that female soccer players on the national team were only earning one-fourth of



the salary of male players, she decided to fight back. She and a group of other female players won their battle to increase pay for women. Alex says, "People say, 'you run like a girl; you play like a girl.' That shouldn't be negative. You should be proud to play like a girl!"
