## BEFORE READING

**The Cover:** Read the title. Allow students to guess what the little girl may be imagining based on the photo.

**The Pictures:** Take a brief picture walk and ask students what they see, think, or wonder about the story.

**Vocabulary:** [Vocabulary Guide](#)

**Prior Knowledge:** Ask students if they have ever pretended to be something. Allow students to Think-Pair-Share about times they pretended to be something they aren't.

**Purpose for Reading:** "As we read, think about how the little girl uses her imagination."

## DURING READING

Check for understanding & make connections:

- What does the girl do when pretend to be a mermaid?
- What does the girl do when pretend to be a tree?
- What does the girl imagine the flowers to be?
- What does the girl do as a pumpkin?
- What does the girl turn into at the end?

## AFTER READING

**Our Purpose:** How does the girl use her imagination to pass the time?

**Extending Our Thinking:** Allow students to select one of the things the girl decided to pretend to be. Allow students to act the scenarios out, and then write about what they thought about or felt.

If your students enjoyed this book...

- Encourage them to continue to discuss it and refer to it in other lessons and conversations.
- Let them explore more about the topic by reading other books with similar themes, structure, characters, or content.
