


The Camping Trip

READ ALOUD GUIDE

Themes: Adventure, Family, Nature

Book Brief: Ernestine is beyond excited to go camping. Will Ernestine be able to enjoy the wilderness, or will it prove to be a bit too far out of her comfort zone?

BEFORE READING

The Cover: Read the title. "This is a book about a family camping trip. What do you think the cousins will do during their camping trip? What makes you think that?"

The Pictures: Flip through some of the pictures. Point out that this book is written and illustrated like a comic book.

Prior Knowledge: What do you know about camping? Complete a Concept Map as a class to build comprehension.

Vocabulary: Before reading, introduce some graphic novel/comic text features such as frame, panel, and speech bubble. Use RIF's How to Read a Graphic Novel: Anchor Chart to support you.

Purpose for Reading: As we read, use the text features to help you understand and enjoy the story.

DURING READING

Check for understanding & make connections:

- What does Ernestine pack for her camping trip? Point out for students that the items are each labeled in the picture.
- Is setting up the tent easy or difficult for Ernestine? Use details in the pictures and words to support your thinking.
- How does Ernestine feel about swimming in the lake? What makes you think that?
- How is hiking different than walking?
- How does Ernestine feel at night? How does her family help her?
- Do you think camping is what Ernestine expected? Do you think she will go camping again? Why or why not?

AFTER READING

Our Purpose: Text features, such as speech bubbles, help bring the story to life. Why do you think the author chose to write this book like a comic/graphic novel?

Extending Our Thinking: As a class, explore the author's process for creating books by visiting her website: https://www.jenniferkmann.com. Then, create your own comic/graphic novel about a family trip or adventure using RIF's Comic Book Strip template.

If your students enjoyed this book...

- Encourage them to continue to discuss it and refer to it in other lessons and conversations.
