READ ALOUD GUIDE

Themes: Counting, Creativity, Humor, Imagination, Innovation

Book Brief: Hetty collects hats from family, friends, and people she meets, turning everyday items and tiny requests into a growing collection. Along the way, she makes friends, learns about others' lives, and uses creativity to find her 100th hat, inspiring readers to start their own collections.

BEFORE READING

The Cover: Have students make predictions about the story based on the cover.

The Pictures: Take a brief picture walk and ask students what they notice about Hetty and her hats.

Prior Knowledge: Ask students, "Do you collect anything? If not, what would you collect?" (Optional: Think, Pair, Share)

Vocabulary: Frontload Tier 2 words using the accompanying Vocabulary Guide.

Purpose for Reading: "As we read today, pay attention to how Hetty gets 100 hats."

DURING READING

Check for understanding & make connections:

- What happened at Grandma's house?
- Why did Hetty's mom try to talk her out of collecting 100 hats?
- How did Hetty make their class history project benefit her?

AFTER READING

Our Purpose: Hetty completes her collection of 100 hats. How did she accomplish this?

Extending Our Thinking: Hetty displayed her 100 hats on hooks. Using <u>RIF's Writing Template</u>, have students write what they would want to collect 100 of and how would they display it?
