


Discussion Guide for Families

Themes: Emotions and Feelings

Book Brief: Molly loves solving problems and learning new things but finds reading, writing, and spelling challenging. With help from her imaginary friend Lexi and her teacher, Molly learns to self-advocate and embrace being different.

READ ALOUD

Before Reading: Build Background

• Tell your child, "This story is about a girl named Molly who has a big imagination and loves solving problems, but sometimes she struggles with reading and writing. Have you ever heard of something called dyslexia? It's when the brain learns in a different way."

While Reading: Make Connection

- What do you think Lexi is? Why do you think Molly calls her an invisible part of herself?
- Why do you think Molly feels nervous about asking for help from her teacher? How does Mr. Mitchell help her feel brave?
- What does Molly learn from Ms. Feltz about being different? How does it make her feel?

After Reading: Ask Questions

• What does Molly's story teach us about asking for help and accepting our differences? Can you think of a time you were brave like Molly?

RELATED ACTIVITIES

If your child enjoyed this book, consider:

- Encourage them to talk about it during other conversations.
