Themes: Emotions and Feelings

Book Brief: *Red: A Crayon's Story* is a funny and insightful tale about embracing your true self despite challenges. Red, labeled as red but truly blue, struggles to meet others' expectations until a new friend helps him realize his authentic identity.

READ ALOUD

Before Reading: Build Background

• Tell your child "Look at the cover of the book and the crayon labeled "Red." Have you ever felt like you were expected to do something that didn't feel right for you?"

While Reading: Make Connections

- Why do you think Red struggles to draw things like strawberries and fire trucks?
- How do the other crayons try to help Red, and why do their efforts not work?
- What changes when Red meets his new friend? How does this friend help him see himself differently?

After Reading: Ask Questions

• What lesson do you think Red learned about being true to himself, and how can you apply that lesson in your own life?
