


Discussion Guide for Families



Rooftop Garden

Themes: Environment and Sustainability

Book Brief: A group of city friends work diligently together to grow herbs and vegetables in a rooftop garden. Set to a foot-tappin' original tune, this rhythmic, rhyming story will have kids singing enthusiastically about the six stages of plant growth. The story concludes with a summer harvest and feast that celebrates the gardeners' commitment.

READ ALOUD

Before Reading: Build Background

• Ask your child "What do you think a rooftop garden is? How might growing plants on a roof be different from growing them on the ground?"

While Reading: Make Connections

- What kinds of plants do the people in the story grow in their rooftop garden?
- How does the rooftop garden help the community and the environment in the story?

• How do the characters feel about their rooftop garden as the story goes on? Why do you think they feel that way?

After Reading: Ask Questions

 What did you learn about how rooftop gardens can help people and the planet? Would you like to create your own rooftop garden? Why or why not?
