READ ALOUD

Before Reading: Build Background

•Ask your child "Have you ever heard of composting? What do you think it means, and why might it be good for the environment?"

While Reading: Make Connections

- What types of things can be composted in the book?
- How does composting help plants grow better?
- What are some of the steps involved in composting, according to the book?

After Reading: Ask Questions

• After learning about composting, how do you think it could help your garden or the planet? Would you like to try composting at home? Why or why not?
