# BEFORE READING

The Cover: Have students make predictions about the story based on the cover.

The Pictures: Take a brief picture walk and ask students what they notice about Minna.

Prior Knowledge: Watch a video about multiple ways to count to 100.

Vocabulary: Frontload Tier 2 words using the accompanying Vocabulary Guide.

Purpose for Reading: "As we read today, watch Minna decide what to do for her Ready, Set, 100th Day! Project."

## **DURING READING**

Check for understanding & make connections:

- What is Minna thinking about? Explain what she has to do for the project.
- · Why do you think Minna rearranges the objects after counting them?
- Why do you think Minna continues to look after finding multiple ways to make 100?

## AFTER READING

Our Purpose: What did Minna do for her Ready, Set, 100th Day! Project?/

Extending Our Thinking: Minna used materials around the house to create a picture for the 100th day. Using , have students think of objects you could use to create your own picture. How would you count to 100? Optional: Have the students create their pictures with objects they choose.
