BEFORE READING

The Cover: Have students make predictions about the story based on the cover.

The Pictures: Take a brief picture walk and ask students what they notice about the people.

Prior Knowledge: Watch a video about inspiring Black icons.

Vocabulary: Frontload Tier 2 words using the accompanying Vocabulary Guide.

Purpose for Reading: "As we read today, we will learn about influential Black icons and how they inspire others."

DURING READING

Check for understanding & make connections: (Answer the following questions per person)

- How did this individual inspire others?
- · How did this individual cause change?

AFTER READING

Our Purpose: Which icon do you find the most inspiring? Why?

Extending Our Thinking: Using <u>RIF's Writing Template</u>, have students select 3-5 Black icons that they identify with. How do they inspire, help, influence you?
