

TIME TO READ!

Before reading: Share the different classifications the editor has chosen to use for the animals in this book. Let children decide the section from which they would like to hear a poem. This book offers many poems and new discoveries about the animals and their habitats.

RELATED ACTIVITIES

CATERPILLAR KABOBS (AGES 5-12)

Ingredients: grapes, skewers, icing, chocolate chips

Read the caterpillar poems (pp. 10, 46). Let children thread grapes onto skewers until full. Dip 2 chocolate chips in icing and place on one end grape for eyes. For a math twist, provide red and green grapes and let children make patterned caterpillars.

PEOPLE POETRY (AGES 7-12)

Let children pair up to interview each other about their likes, dislikes, *habitat*, and favorite foods, sports, books, and movies. From that information, have them create a poem about their partner.


