Anna & Natalie has a surprise, or twist, ending. Write a story or draw a comic strip about an ordinary day at school that has a surprising ending.




CELEBRATION WREATH

- 3. Glue the hands together (fingers facing out) to make a wreath to display. For a more stable wreath, glue hands onto a backing of poster board or a paper plate.
