TIME TO READ!

Before reading: Discuss what children think goes into making a music video. Dance choreography? Music? Set design? This book is about a famous American ballet that was created before music videos were popular. What kind of dancing is ballet?

RELATED ACTIVITIES

SETTING THE STAGE (AGES 8-12)

Materials: scrap materials around the center, glue or tape, scissors, paper

Martha Graham wanted a simple set that showed "a new town." If you were making your own dance show, where would you set it? What do you need to think about when you choose a set? How does the set affect the rest of the show? Use scrap materials to build a model of your set like Isamu Noguchi did, or draw a picture of your set.

APPALACHIAN REMIX (AGES 5-12)

The Shakers are a Christian religious group that believes in hard work and simplicity. Aaron Copland was inspired by one of their hymns. Listen to the original (www.youtube.com/watch?v=qOTkI3HGZhM) and Copland's version (www.youtube.com/watch?v=xDRWdNn_nLk). How are they similar? Different? Let children work in groups to take a simple song (e.g., Twinkle Twinkle Little Star) and transform it into

something new. Have them perform their "remixes." Which group was most creative?

STORYBOOK DANCING (AGES 5-12)

Dance is often used to tell a story. Have each child think of a popular fairy tale or children's book. How would they tell that story through a dance? Let kids take turns dancing out different stories for the group.

Be sure they keep the stories secret and let the rest of the group try to "read" the dances!
