TIME TO READ!

Before reading: Tell children that this story takes place in Thailand. Show Thailand on a map or globe. Thailand is in a tropical part of Asia. Ask children to look for signs of this type of environment in the pictures and story.

RELATED ACTIVITIES

ELEPHANT PENCIL HOLDER (AGES 6-12)

Elephants are a traditional symbol in Thailand.

Materials: empty soup can, construction paper, tacky glue, scissors, tape, wiggle eyes

- 1. Cut paper to fit can. Wrap around can and tape.
- 2. Cut out ovals for ears. Fold in 1/2 inch so ears stick out and glue onto can.
- Cut out thin strip of paper for trunk. Roll on pencil or fold and unfold to make it curl. Glue on can.
- 4. Glue on eyes.



RICE PICTURES (AGES 5-12)

The staple food item in Thailand is rice. The Thai people eat it at almost every meal.

Materials: large plastic baggies, rice, food coloring, rubbing alcohol, newspaper, glue, thick paper

- 1. Place 3 cups rice in baggie.
- 2. Mix 1/4 cup alcohol and food coloring. Pour into baggie and mix with rice.
- 3. Once colored, lay rice out on newspaper to dry. Repeat with different colors.
- 4. When dry, use rice to create pictures.
- 5. Draw design in pencil on thick paper. Place glue on part of design; cover with rice. Shake off extra. Repeat until picture is complete.
