### PIRATE TELESCOPES

Materials: paper towel or toilet paper tube, stickers, markers

Decorate the tubes with markers and stickers. Have the children use the telescopes to "spy" something special about each of their friends.



#### POPSICLE PIRATE PUPPET

Materials: popsicle stick, paper plate, black construction paper, markers, scissors

Have kids draw a face on the plate. Cut a triangle of black construction paper and glue it on the plate to make a pirate hat. Attach a popsicle stick to the bottom of the plate for a handle.



## TREASURE HUNT

Materials: plastic coins, magazine pictures of children

Attach pictures to plastic coins. Hide them

around the classroom or outside. After they find the "treasures," have the kids share and tell how they are the same as or different from the person in their picture.




#### PIRATE SHIP SNACK

Materials: apples (green, red, yellow), cheddar cheese (cut into triangles), toothpicks

Grown-ups cut the apples into small wedges. Give each child one wedge from each color of apple. With a toothpick, stick a triangle of cheese into every

wedge to make a sail. As you eat, discuss how each color of apple tastes.





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
