### **TIME TO READ!**

#### BEFORE WE READ, LET'S LOOK AT...

The Cover: What predictions can you make about this story from the cover illustration?

The Pictures: Show the cover page. How would you describe the look on Ella's face in this picture? What do you think is going through her mind at that moment?

Prior Knowledge: Briefly discuss why students think the author chose this topic.

Vocabulary: plugged, technology, unplugged

As we read, think about ways that technology improves our lives and ways it creates new challenges.

**Extending Our Thinking:** Ask these open-ended questions: Can you recall a time when you felt like Ella? Explain. What can you infer about Ella's family from the illustrations in the text? Is there a better solution to the problem Ella had? Who do you think implemented the changes? Explain.
